Freely giving of your talent, time and effort. • Social issues: Poverty, crime, food security, food production • Social Activism: An intentional action with the goal of bringing about social change. • Social Justice: Redressing the situation. • Poverty: Having little money or few possessions, not having enough money to meet basic needs. • Responsible citizen: Has knowledge about his/her role in community, provinces and the world. A responsible citizen has a role in making the world a better place to live (for every component in biosphere). A responsible citizen is change agent that acts out against injustice in social, economic, and environmental sectors. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A) Contemporary Environmental issues affect certain sectors of society more than others:

<p>The impact on the poor, farmers, rural communities and shack dwellers</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Droughts, water shortage and land degradation – They live in country side and tend to farm, with limited irrigation and rely on natural resources such as rivers, trees, and land for grazing of crops. Land could be degraded from poor farming techniques, soil erosion caused by wind and water. Air pollution – The poor who live in or near cities, have limited electricity. They burn wood and coal which causes air pollution. Land and Water Pollution - Often areas around them have rubbish dumps so it can affect their health. The poor rely on rivers which often become polluted by sewerage waste.
