Dear Parent,

I hope this message finds you well. I wanted to inform you that the May/June exam is scheduled to commence on 25th May 2026 for Gr 8 – 11 and 20 May for Gr 12. The timetable is finalised and have been shared with ALL learners.

Please note that learners have between 4 to 9 days left before the commencement of the exams. This period is crucial for them to prepare adequately and make the most of their remaining study time.

If you have any concerns or questions regarding the upcoming exams, please don't hesitate to reach out to us. We are here to support both you and your child throughout this process. Thank you for your cooperation and ongoing support.

### **Instructions for learners during the May/June exam:**

1. Ensure punctuality, arriving at 7:20 a.m. Utilize reliable transportation.
2. Expect scanning with metal detectors to prevent irregularities; electronic devices are prohibited.
3. Avoid wearing wristwatches.
4. Be seated in the exam venue one hour before the exam starts.
5. Provide proof of identity, mandatory for all Grade 12 learners.
6. Refrain from assisting or communicating with other learners.
7. Maintain decorum in the exam room; no disturbances or improper behavior.
8. Do not socialize or sleep at desks during the exam.
9. Follow instructions from invigilators.
10. Prohibited items include books, memoranda, notes, maps, photos, or any materials that may aid in the exam.
11. Non-compliance with instructions may result in receiving zero for that particular paper.
12. Utilize the 10-minute reading time before the exam; no writing allowed during this period.
13. Electronic devices such as cell phones, iPods, earphones, smartwatches, or Google glasses are forbidden in the exam room.
14. Acts of dishonesty, including cell phone usage, possession of notes, group copying, or impersonation, will result in receiving zero for that paper.

### **ADVICE TO PARENTS:**

**1. Reliable Transportation Arrangements:** Ensure that your child has reliable transportation to and from school during exam days. This may involve confirming bus schedules, arranging carpools, or discussing transportation options with your child if they're commuting independently.



**2. Necessary Stationery:** Check that your child has all the necessary stationery for their exams, such as pens, pencils, erasers, rulers, and any specialized items like a math set. It's important to have these supplies well in advance to avoid last-minute stress.

# LETTER TO GRADE 12 LEARNERS AND PARENTS



Dear Grade 12 Learners and Parents,

As we prepare for the demanding months ahead, we would like to emphasize the importance of the upcoming Winter School Programme for all Grade 12 learners. The academic calendar for the remainder of the year places significant pressure on the available teaching and learning time. The Preliminary Examinations are expected to commence on **17 August**, which is only **18 days after the reopening of schools in Term 3**.

Furthermore, the National Senior Certificate (NSC) Final Examinations are expected to begin on **21 October**, allowing only **11 school days in Term 4** before the start of the final examinations.

This means that Grade 12 learners have approximately **28 academic school days remaining** before the commencement of the final NSC examinations. It is therefore essential that every available opportunity is used effectively to complete the syllabus, strengthen understanding of subject content, and improve examination readiness.

The Winter School Programme has been organised to:

- Ensure completion of the curriculum and outstanding syllabus content;
- Provide learners with additional academic support and guidance;
- Strengthen understanding of key concepts and challenging sections;
- Allow sufficient time later in the term for revision and examination preparation;

Prepare learners thoroughly for both the Preliminary and Final NSC Examinations. Attendance at Winter School is therefore **mandatory** for all Grade 12 learners. Regular attendance and active participation will contribute significantly towards academic success and improved performance.

Parents are kindly requested to support the school by ensuring that learners attend all Winter School sessions punctually and consistently.

The Winter School timetable will be attached for your convenience.

We trust that learners will approach this opportunity with dedication, responsibility, and determination as they prepare for the final stretch of their school career.

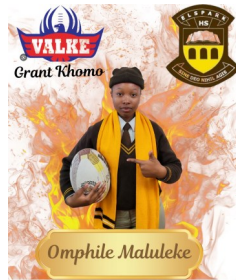

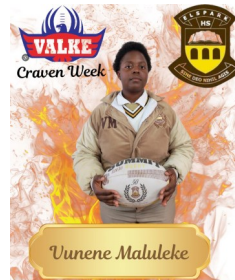

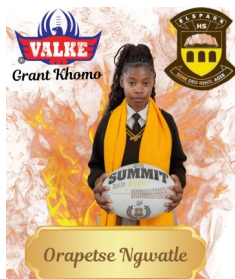
